In addition, during that same time period, CMS reports that Holyoke's percentage of long-stay residents who were physically restrained was above the Massachusetts and national averages.

HealthBridge's Lowell Health Care Center and Newton Health Care Center have also used antipsychotics at rates that are higher than the Massachusetts and national averages, according to CMS.
